



• As of March 2022, 29% (113,347) of nursing and midwifery staff of NHS Trusts and CCGs, NHS Organisations and IHPs* were from BME ethnicity. This is an increase of 14,737 (3.9%) from the previous year.








Regional distribution of BAME staff (WRES 2022)
